Zipcar is an affordable transportation option that lets you have all the luxuries of having your own car on campus, without the hassle. An Ursinus College membership is \$25, with rates for Zipcar vehicles on campus starting at \$7.50 per hour and \$69 per day. After the first year, members will pay an annual membership fee of \$35.

Gas, insurance, and up to 180 miles of driving per day are included in Zipcar rates, and cars can be reserved for as little
