The Spirit of Shabbat—Shabbat and social justice

How do the basic ideas of Shabbat relate to social justice?

וַכַּרוֹן לַמַעשָה בָרָאשִית ... זֶכֵּר לַיצִיאַת מִצְרַים.

Zikaron l'ma'aseh b'reishit ... zekher litziat mitrayim Shabbat is "a reminder of the work of creation and the exodus from Egypt" (Erev Shabbat Kiddush)

CREATION

Genesis 1:27:

וַיִּבְרָא אֶלֹהִיםוּ אֶת־הָאָדָם בְּצַלְמֹוֹ בְּצֵלֶם אֱלֹהָים בֵּרָא אֹתְוֹ זָכָר וּנְקַבָּה בֵּרָא אֹתָם:

And God created the human in God's own image; in the image of God, God created the human; male and female God created them.

Mishnah Sanhedrin 4:5:

כיצד מאימין (את העדים) על עדי נפשות. ... לפיכך נברא אדם יחידי, ללמדך, שכל המאבד נפש אחת מישראל, מעלה עליו הכתוב כאלו אבד עולם מלא. ומפני שלום הבריות, שלא יאמר אדם לחברו, אבא גדול מאביך....

How do we press the witnesses in a capital case? ... (The judges' speech continues:) "It was for this reason that a human was first created as one person (viz. Adam), to teach you that anyone who destroys a life (some editions: from Israel) is considered by Scripture to have destroyed an entire world; and anyone who saves a life (some editions: from Israel) is as if he saved an entire world." [And also, to promote peace among the creations, that no person would say to his/her friend, "My ancestors are greater than yours."...] ...
